
Tasmania's South West

Richard Bennett

Richard will lead a group of 6 professional and/or enthusiast photographers along the dramatic coastline between Melaleuca and Ketchem Bay.

There is so much to photograph in this beautiful remote location:
Vast button grass plains with mountains rising high in the distance;
White sandy beaches between forested headlands;
Tasmania's signature tannin coloured rivers weaving their way to the ocean;
Wild ocean waves rolling into the shore.
Creep out of your tent to capture the first light or click quietly away as the afternoon rays disappear.

Sharpen your photography skills;
Hear about Richard's philosophy behind the camera;
Find or hone your own photographic philosophy; and
Enjoy the freedom to creatively consider your photographic career free from distraction.**

Day 1

9am - Depart Cambridge Airport with Par Avion.

Scenic flight over mountainous terrain or the spectacular southern coastline (determined by the weather).

9.45am - Arrive Melaleuca Airstrip, South West World Heritage Area.

The walk sets off across rolling button grass plains towards the coast. We stop for lunch on the track.

There is a great photographic opportunity at a pretty creek. It is flanked by grass-covered riverbanks, which are manicured to perfection by the local wildlife.

Tonight's camp is behind an ocean beach at New Harbour.

Day 2

Photographic opportunities are plentiful at New Harbour. We will spend some time making the most of first light at this pretty location. Mid-morning we'll commence walking with a short steep climb through rainforest. We come out onto open ridges with great coastal views. Our destination today is Hidden Bay. This is a very picturesque beach. The creek near our campsite is a great location for morning and evening photography.

Day 3

Today is an easy walk to Ketchem Bay. This is a truly remote and beautiful place. It has great ocean views looking west towards South West Cape, one of the great capes of the Southern Hemisphere.

Day 4

After early morning photography we pack up our tents and see a different aspect of the landscape as we make our way back to New Harbour. We camp at the eastern end of the beach beside a pretty creek.

Day 5

Our final day is a leisurely stroll back to Melaleuca to meet our flight. We enjoy lunch at the airstrip before returning to Hobart. If the weather allows, we take the alternate route to our flight in.

Richard will share how he has innovated in his business to sustain a profitable 50-year career out of photographing the things that he loves. In particular, how he approaches photographing the Tasmanian Wilderness.



Tasmania's South West World Heritage Area

Date: 6 – 10 March 2016

Duration: 5 days, 4 nights

Location: South West World Heritage Area, Tasmania (Melaleuca to Ketchem Bay return)

Departs from/returns to Cambridge Airport, Hobart, Tasmania

Inclusions: Scenic flight in both directions in a light aircraft (approximately 45 minutes each way), experienced guide, food, park fees, and tent (twin-share or single).

Price: \$2390

Each participant is required to carry a pack with their own gear and a portion of the communal food.

Depending on personal gear, expect to carry between 15-18 kilos.

The walking time is approximately 4 hours per day at a leisurely pace.
